

Our donation provided 8.4% of private-sector funding, or 4.8% of all funding, that allowed Project VIDA to continue with the Microenterprise Technical Assistance Program. Despite the COVID-19 pandemic lockdowns and economic devastation, the GECU Foundation was able to help Project VIDA with ...

#### CASA OF EL PASO \$5,000 DONATED

In 2020, CASA of El Paso assisted 663 abused and neglected children with the help of 247 advocates. Our donation helped CASA of El Paso recruit, train and retain advocates to assist more children during the COVID-19 pandemic and into the future.



### NURSE-FAMILY PARTNERSHIP \$2,500 DONATED

In order to maintain children's developmental goals during the COVID-19 pandemic, nurses from the Nurse-Family Partnership encouraged families to improve their child's brain function with quality playtime. Since nurses were unable to visit client homes, our donation helped purchase baby walkers and sensory toys for infants and toddlers that families could use at home with parents.

# EL PASOANS FIGHTING HUNGER FOOD BANK \$60,000 DONATED

The COVID-19 pandemic directly impacted the ability for many individuals to financially provide for themselves and their families. El Pasoans Fighting Hunger Food Bank is always working to address food insecurity among children, families and seniors in the El Paso community and our donation helped provide healthy food to those in need. The food bank distributed more than 1 million emergency food boxes and more than 139 million pounds of food in 2020. Food insecurity increased by 500% as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic and we were able to make a big impact in our community.

#### HOSPITAL 58,33<u>3 DONAT</u>

As the number of surgeries continue to increase, the need for an efficient, high-level sterilization unit was essential due to COVID-19. Our donation funded the purchase of a UV sterilization machine which allows for a more-sterile environment, a quicker turnaround of patient rooms and the ability to serve more patients. The UV sterilization machine was a success for the health and well-being of our pediatric population.

#### LOWER DYER COMMUNITY CENTER \$29,133 DONATEE

The Lower Dyer Community Center was unable to offer many of the regular programs that they provide but they were still able to make a big impact in 2020. They served 92,017 meals and 7,193 individuals through the monthly food pantry. For Thanksgiving, LDCC assisted 221 families with a turkey and other dinner foods to enjoy the holiday together. The center also provided 450 children with a Christmas gift and the opportunity to take a picture with Santa, Dru Blue, Chico and Ozzy. The Lower Dyer Community Center is essential in our community and we are proud to be a part of its impact.
