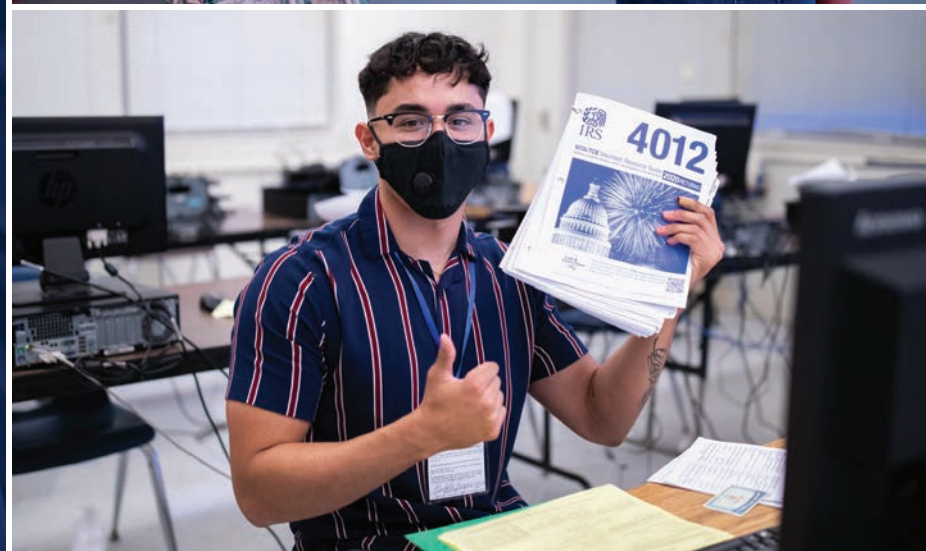

VITA

The GECU Foundation received a \$200,000 grant to implement the VITA program in our community. Since 2014, the Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program has offered free tax filing assistance to qualifying families with the help of our certified and bilingual team of volunteers. With 23 locations throughout El Paso, the VITA program has successfully been able to reach and help many local taxpayers.

In 2021, VITA filed a record-breaking 10,482 tax returns, helped bring in a total of \$19.5 million dollars in tax refunds to the region, and helped save more than \$3.1 million dollars in tax-preparation fees. VITA also helped many individuals receive the Earned Income Tax Credit, a refundable credit that is often overlooked by taxpayers. VITA volunteers ensured that those eligible claimed the credit, bringing in a total of \$7.5 million in Earned Income Tax Credits. With VITA, hardworking families and individuals are saving money and often getting a financial boost that can help them make a payment on their vehicle or even start an emergency savings fund.

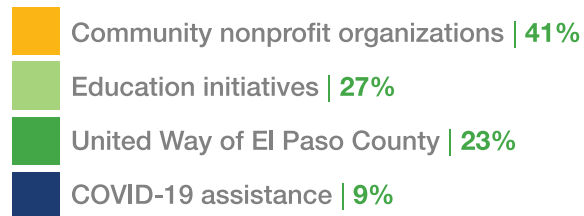
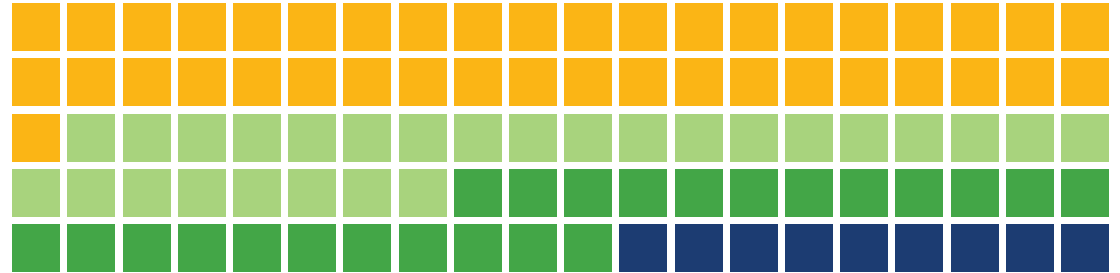
The VITA program had a total of 271 volunteers with 14,166 hours volunteered by the end of the 2021 program.



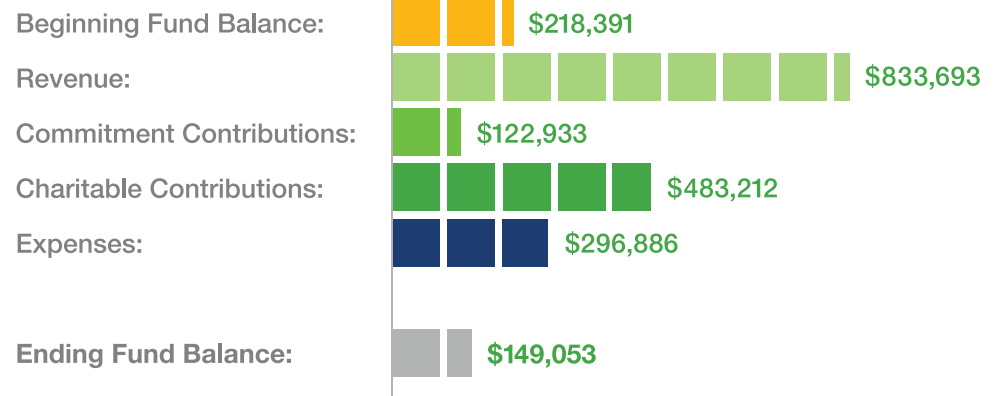

We help provide students with the necessary tools needed to succeed in the financial and health care fields, and we provide services that will improve the overall health of our community.

MAKING AN IMPACT THROUGH EDUCATION

UTEP BANKING ACADEMY

\$250,000 DONATED

The UTEP Banking Academy program provides an opportunity for those seeking to develop skills to generate a career path in financial services in El Paso. GECU was the first financial institution to support this initiative with an overall commitment of \$250,000. In addition to our donation, GECU Chief Commercial Services Officer Chris Tompkins sits on the advisory board of The UTEP Banking Academy — helping students to strengthen and develop skills through internships, job workshops, and site visits to banks and financial institutions.



TEXAS TECH DENTAL

\$323,000 DONATED

The Texas Tech Woody L. Hunt School of Dental Medicine is the first dental school on the U.S.–Mexico border and it inaugurated its first dental class with 40 students in August 2021. Our donation funded the 2021 dental program for three students — giving them the opportunity to pursue their education in El Paso and gain skills that will help the dental and oral care of the community. The opening of TTUHSC El Paso is fundamental to GECU Foundation's mission to elevate our community because it will help solve health disparities of oral health care in the borderland, which will impact the overall health and wellness of our community.





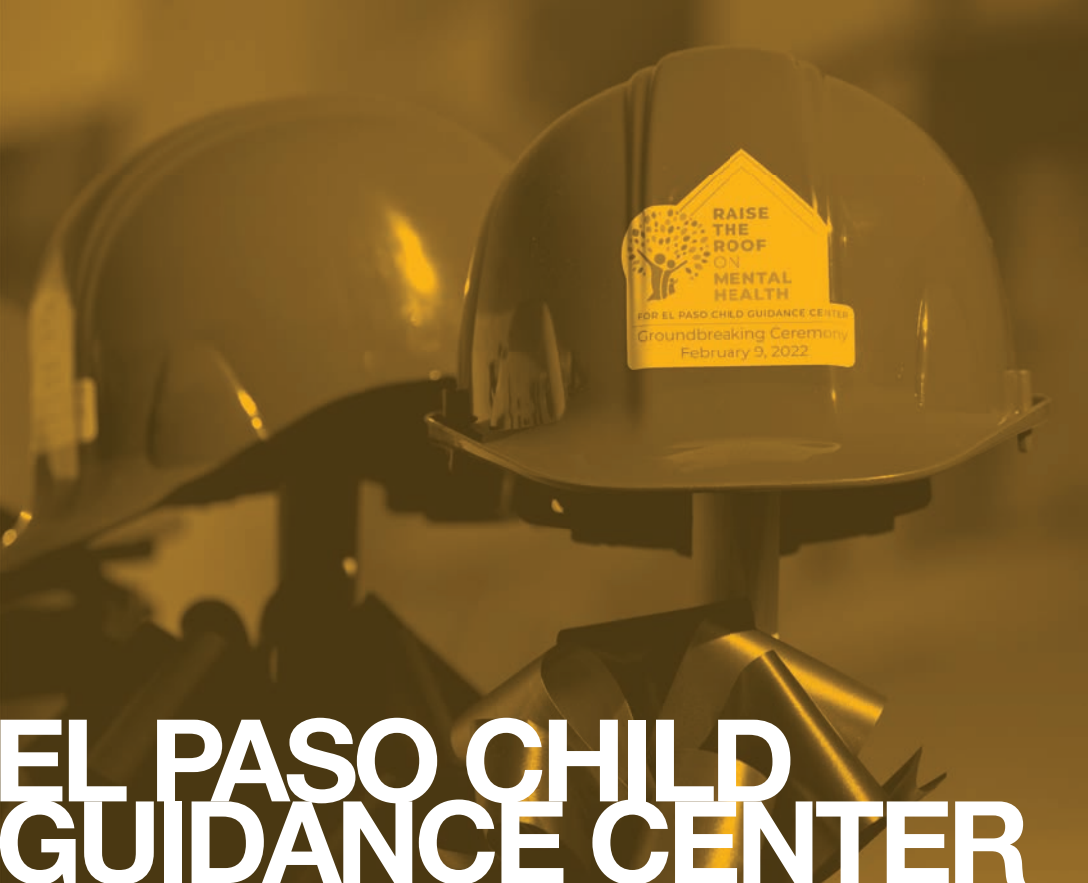

YMCA

\$10,000 DONATED

The YMCA of El Paso continues to be committed to strengthening our community by connecting people to their potential purpose and one another. The YMCA is grateful for the support that GECU has provided throughout the years and as CEO Bill Coon stated, "GECU's continued support of the YMCA of El Paso will allow us to continue to provide after-school care, swim lessons, and adult and senior group classes for another 135 years for El Paso families." In 2021, a \$10,000 donation from the GECU Foundation gave them the ability to provide 7,800 children their after-school program, 2,525 swim lessons, and host multiple pop-up COVID-19 vaccine sites in our community.



EL PASO CHILD GUIDANCE CENTER

\$25,000 DONATED

In response to an urgent community need, the Children Guidance Center launched an ambitious \$3.2-million-dollar capital campaign to renovate and expand their main center in the historic Five Points neighborhood. Thanks to a partnership with the City of El Paso and community donors like the GECU Foundation, the center will be able to provide their mental health services to more El Paso families. In 2021, our donation and other community donors' donations helped the Children Guidance Center to provide services to a total of 2,543 clients and meet the needs of ...

- 5,000 therapy and child psychiatry sessions
- 1,347 individuals who received direct mental health services
- 1,196 individuals who served with mental health education



CANDLELIGHTERS EL PASO

\$10,000 DONATED

Candlelighters provides services that support the needs of children with cancer and their caregivers across El Paso. Families are provided with immediate rent and utilities assistance, a weekly food pantry, unreimbursed medical expenses, local transportation, out-of-town travel for medical treatment, and funeral costs when necessary. Our donation was distributed to provide food assistance and transportation to these families. In 2021, Candlelighters reported 1,101 food-pantry distributions, 120 direct payments for local-transportation assistance, and six direct payments for out-of-town travel.

HOSPICE OF EL PASO

\$25,000 DONATED

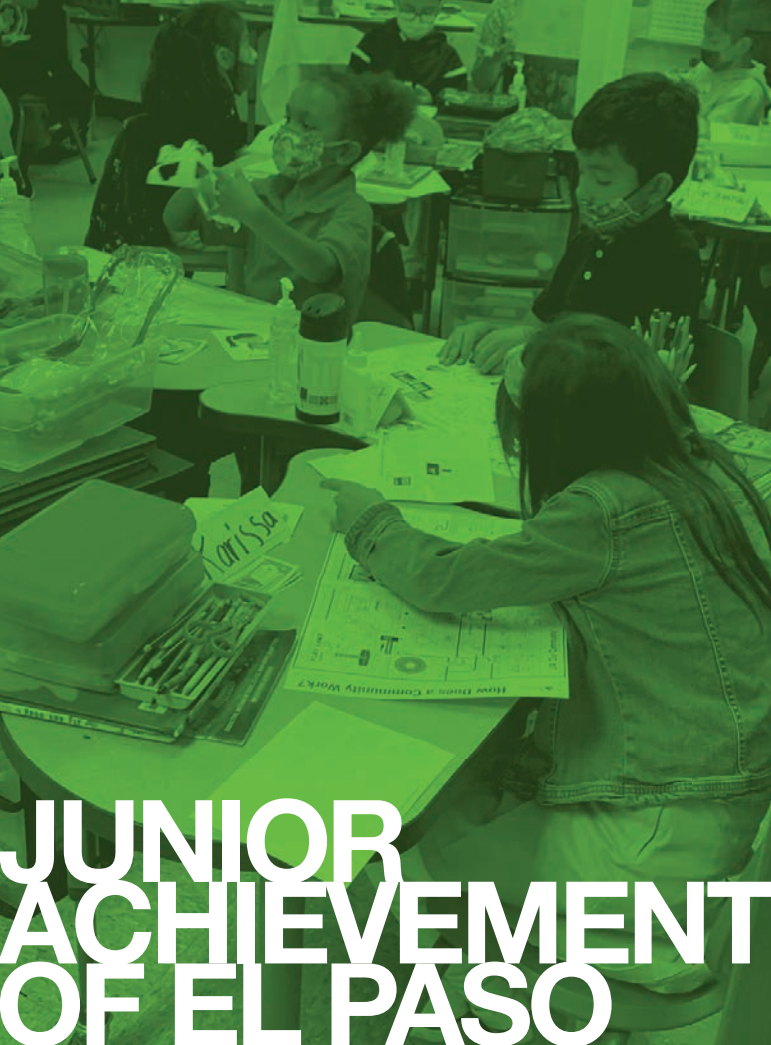
The mission of Hospice of El Paso is to provide comfort, care, and choice for patients at the end of their life's journey while guiding their loved ones through the grieving process. In 2021, Hospice of El Paso was able to provide 426 days of essential care for 150 veterans and their families. Our donation funded up to 141 days of essential care to those individuals.



UNITED WAY OF
EL PASO COUNTY

\$135,000 DONATED

As our community continues to navigate the challenges brought on by the pandemic, our partnership with United Way of El Paso has been able to continue to support their Community Impact Fund as well as their August 3 remembrance efforts. In 2021, our donation helped them fund 27 local programs and collaborated with more than 10 programs in the community. In addition, the GECU Foundation has supported United Way with their Family Resiliency Center remembrance efforts, which includes the two-day annual luminaria drive-through event that attracts more than 1,000 people who come together to honor the lives of those we lost in the tragedy of August 3, 2019.



JUNIOR ACHIEVEMENT OF EL PASO

\$5,000 DONATED

The Junior Achievement programs set young people to a successful future by providing necessary career skills. Our donation funded Junior Achievement programs for 167 students from 10 classrooms at Pebble Hills Elementary School. Junior Achievement alumni are more likely to obtain a college degree, have knowledge of managing money, be successful in their careers, and start a business as an adult. This program directs young students on the right path to making strong career choices.

THE CHILD CRISIS CENTER OF EL PASO

\$3,500 DONATED

The Child Crisis Center continues to be the leading child-abuse protection agency in El Paso since 1980. Our donation allowed CCCEP to purchase a refrigerator that helped serve meals to 475 children in 2021. In addition, our donation helped purchase new clothes for every child in the center — which for many of them was the first set of new clothes.

OPPORTUNITY CENTER FOR THE HOMELESS

\$5,000 DONATED

The Opportunity Center for the Homeless provided shelter services to 2,535 individuals in 2021. Our donation supported their work for their men's shelter that provides housing, basic necessities, and access to medical and mental health care for up to 80 men per evening for five consecutive evenings.
