UMC: SOBREVIVIENDO EL CÁNCER PROGRAM \$50,000 DONATED

The Sobreviviendo el Cáncer program is based at the UMC Infusion Center in El Paso, Texas, and provides psychosocial support and short-term funding to cancer patients. Approximately 37% of UMC's cancer patients are uninsured and/or come from a low-income background. The additional cost of co-payments for treatment and medication, medical equipment, and supplies and transportation needs can become an overwhelming barrier to their fight. The program aims to identify and assist with the challenges that may interfere with the patient's treatment plan to improve their treatment outcomes and their quality of life.
